The Donald A. Wells Preaching Prize winner for 2025 is Katy Fazio, a student at Boston University School of Theology and seminarian at the UCC Church in Milton, MA. Established when Don was named Executive Director Emeritus of the Massachusetts Bible Society, the award is given annually to a student who preaches the best sermon on a biblical text dealing with a social justice

Monday, March 10, 6pm, Old South Meeting House, 310 Washington St


Have you ever wondered what it was like for Phillis Wheatley to worship upstairs at the Old South Meeting House? Or about the worship life of the other members of African descent whose names are etched on the leaves of our Memorial Tree in the Columbarium? Join us as historian Richard Boles, author of Dividing the Faith: The Rise of Segregated Churches in the Early American North, talks about the 18th c. circumstances of Native Americans and enslaved African Americans in New England who worshipped, were baptized, and took communion in predominantly white churches with segregated seating and other race-based proscriptions. The Old South Church community is invited to a wine and cheese reception at 5:15 p.m. prior to Professor Boles' talk.
