NOTES ON TODAY'S CALL TO WORSHIP

James Weldon Johnson (1871-1938) was born in Jacksonville, Florida to immigrant parents from the Bahamas. He attended Atlanta University (now Clark Atlanta University) where he studied literature and music. Johnson wrote and edited numerous historically significant books of poetry and literature. In 1900, he penned "Lift Every Voice and Sing." His works explored racial identity and the African American folk tradition. Johnson was a teacher, principal, activist and a national organizer for the NAACP.
