In a time when so much aggression is targeting immigrants and BIPOC people, what better way to reclaim our Christian Faith from the loud Christian Nationalists than honoring and celebrating the festival of a culture that once was colonized by the United States, and we will do it within the sacred space of a church that helped gave birth to the United States. Join us for a time of spiritual reflections and connections, food and fun, art, literature, and music.

BLACK HISTORY MOMENT

This week, we spotlight one of Boston's native sons, Allen Rohan Crite (1910-2007). A resident of the South End and lower Roxbury, Crite dedicated much of his career to documenting the Black community there and in nearby neighborhoods. Mr. Crite continuously recorded the people and places of Boston in his art and writing. Alongside his representations of everyday life in the city, Crite also incorporated religious themes, blurring the boundaries between the secular and the sacred.

In January, members of (G)RACE Speaks and other congregants visited an exhibition of Crite's work featured at the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum and the Boston Athenaeum. The exhibits featured a sweeping overview of Crite's long career and legacy as a storyteller and knowledge keeper. Mr. Crite has gifted us a window for better understanding the history and culture of African Americans in our city.

The Museum of African American History is New England's largest museum dedicated to preserving, conserving and interpreting the contributions of African Americans. In Boston and Nantucket, the Museum has preserved two historic sites and two trails that tell the story of organized Black communities from the Colonial Period through the 19th century. Exhibits, programs, and education activities at the Museum showcase the powerful stories of Black families who worshipped, educated their children, debated the issues of the day, produced great art, organized politically and advanced the cause of freedom. Old South is proud to support their work of keeping history alive by making a \$1,000 donation to their efforts.
