PARKING VALIDATION CHANGES

Starting immediately, Old South is excited to share that we have a new and improved parking validation option with the Back Bay Garage. Entrances are at 85 St James Ave and 199 Clarendon St. The Back Bay Garage is closer and more affordable than our previous other parking options. It offers weekend rates of up to 3 hours for \$5, and up to 11 hours for \$8, as well as weeknights after 5:00 PM for \$8. Park your car, come to the church, request a coupon at the front desk (coupons vary by time) and then pay as you exit the garage. The 100 Clarendon garage can still be validated; however, validation remains \$10 for up to 3 hours. Beyond 3 hours, you have to pay full price.

Beginning March 22, we will no longer cover parking at the Prudential Center Garage due to rising costs. The Prudential garage charges the church over \$40, which is 4-5 times more expensive than other options. This change will save the church a significant amount of money while providing a more convenient and more affordable option for many.

GREEN TIP: Recycling Plastic Wrap and Film

Plastic wrap and film packaging are generally made using #2 (HDPE) and #4 (LDPE) plastic resins, both of which are technically recyclable. However, plastic film cannot go in your curbside recycling bin because it tangles sorting equipment and causes costly shutdowns at recycling facilities. Instead, plastic film must be taken to designated drop-off locations or recycled through specialized programs. When properly recycled, plastic film is typically processed into composite lumber, construction materials, new flexible films, and a variety of other products.
