The Theological Book Group's new book's focus is 'forgiveness': *Not So Sorry: Abusers, False Apologies and the Limits of Forgiveness* by Kaya Oakes. She delves into the misuses of forgiveness, arguing that it has its limits and can even become a form of spiritual abuse when victims are encouraged or even forced to forgive. And how do we understand Jesus' concept of forgiveness in a first century world? This will be a challenging 8-9 week series.
