

The Drinking Gourd

"The Drinking Gourd" is a map song used by Underground Railroad operatives to disseminate escape instructions. The many 'sing posts' encoded in the text enabled fleeing slaves to make their way north along the Ohio River to freedom. Taken at face value, the "drinking gourd" refers to the hollowed-out gourd used by slaves (and other rural Americans) as a water dipper. But here it is used as a code name for the Big Dipper star formation, which points to Polaris, the North Star.

Follow the drinking gourd, follow the drinking gourd, for the old man is a-waitin' for to carry you to freedom, if you follow the drinking gourd.

When the sun comes back and the first quail calls, follow the drinking gourd.

The river bank will make a very good road,

the dead trees will show you the way.

The little river ends between two hills, there's another river on the other side, where the great river meets the little river, follow the drinking gourd.



MIDDLE PASSAGE REMEMBRACE CEREMONIES

Jazz Worship August 18th and First and Festival Worship on August 21st

Gathered in 1669, Old South Church in Boston continues to research, name and account for a history which includes radical abolitionists and the first anti-slavery tract on this soil (1700) AND many early ministers and members who were enslavers, who benefited from the forced enslavement and unpaid work of countless persons of African descent. We will honor the lives of our African members from the 1600s, 1700s, and early 1800s on Middle Passage Sunday.

The Middle Passage Installation of Remembrance, in Old South's portico, presents a large banner (17' x 5') featuring the image of human persons packed as cargo into a ship. Juxtaposed to this cruel, dehumanizing practice, are bold images -- faces and families --

of those who might be the descendants of enslaved persons, or what these persons might have looked like before having been enslaved. The United Nations has 23rd designated August the International Dav for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and its Abolition. "The slave trade is not merely a thing of the past it has shaped the world we live in,



it has molded the face of modern societies, creating indissoluble ties between peoples, irreversibly transforming economies, cultures and customs across the world," said UNESCO Director-General Irina Bokova. "The slave trade concerns not only people of African descent but the whole of humanity."

KENTUCKY FLOOD RELIEF

SEARCH FOR A NEW ASSOCIATE MINISTER

Working closely with Associate Conference Minister Alex Shea Will, they'll begin by drafting a fresh position description for an Associate Minister - probably to serve for a specific, limited term that would extend into the tenure of a new settled Senior Minister to give some continuity. Then they'll seek and interview candidates hoping to find a finalist who could be appointed by Council by mid- to late fall. Meanwhile, all members of the current staff will be working shoulder-to-shoulder to keep all the many dimensions of Old South's life and work at full strength.
