


Lord, we have come at your own invitation, chosen by you, to be counted your friends; yours is the strength that sustains dedication; ours, a commitment we know never ends.

Our communion table is open to all.


Cups contain only non-alcoholic grape juice. Gluten-free crackers are available at a station under the pulpit.

Highlights of the silver gracing our Communion Table Today

Second Church & Society Goblet (1844)

Goblet, 8" high, with handles.

Presented to the Old South Church by the Second Church and Society,

"in memorial of their Christian hospitality"

The Second Church of Boston, founded in 1649, was a Puritan church, then Congregational until 1802, when it became Unitarian. It began in North Square, then moved to Hanover St in 1779, merging with New Brick Church that was on the site. In 1844, the brick church was demolished and a new building at that location was completed in 1845. Given the timing of their renovation and the wording of the inscription, it seems likely that Old South Church extended hospitality to the Second Church during their time of transition.

The Salem St. Church Breadbasket (1848)

This breadbasket is a curved plate with handles and feet, 11.5" in diameter. Made by Palmer Bachelders, an American silversmith based in Boston.

Inscribed "I am the living bread which came down from heaven."

This breadbasket was given to Salem Street Church by a parishioner in 1848 for use on the communion table. It was sold by Salem Street Church when it was no longer being used, and the proceeds used for the charity of the church. It was purchased by "B.F.W.," passed to his son, and then donated by him in 1926 to the Old South Church.

Ruth Manning Gordon Beaker (1900)

Beaker, 5" diameter with handles.

Made by Gorham, an American silversmith,

and marked with his Lion Anchor G symbol.

Donated by Rev. George Warren Field D. D. in honor of Ruth Manning Gordon.

Ruth Manning Gordon (1895-1985) was the daughter of George Angier Gordon (1853-1929) and Susan Manning Gordon (1857-1936). Rev. George Gordon was the pastor of Old South Church 1884-1927. Ruth Manning Gordon joined Old South in 1909. Rev. George Warren Field (1818-1900) was a pastor at the Central Church, Bangor, Maine. George Gordon and George Warren field both attended Bangor Theological Seminary and Gordon's first pastorate was in Temple, Maine, so the two men may have been peers. The timing of the gift coincides with the year of death of Rev. Fields, so may have been a bequest in his will.

SCARED FOR GOOD CONCERT



Old South families (and interested adults) are invited to join into a fall book study as we read indigenous author Linda Coombs' young readers book: Colonization and the Wampanoag Story. This book presents a duet of stories -- one, a first-person account of a young Wampanoag child and what her life, education, and



faith looked like -- and the other the story of the 'English' arriving and colonizing the area. These two veins of storytelling alternate back and forth, presenting the very different mindsets of the Wampanoag and other indigenous tribes and the arriving colonizers.

In conjunction with the Congregational Library, Kate Nintcheu, (Dir. Children and Families) has created a book study curriculum, breaking up the readings into 5 sections over 9 weeks -- including an author talk on zoom on Tuesday October 29 and a visit to the Congregational Library to view some of the artifacts they hold from this time period on Sunday November 17. Families are encouraged to read the book over the week, and to set aside time to discuss the 3-5 discussion questions together before beginning the next sections.
