## **NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC**

Adolphus Hailstork was born in Rochester, New York and educated at Howard University, Manhattan School of Music, and Michigan State University. Among his many composition teachers was the famed Nadia Boulanger of Paris, who in addition to being an exceptional composer in her own right mentored many of the greatest European and American composers of the 20th century, including Aaron Copland. Hailstork is of African-American ancestry and his works blend musical ideas from both the African-American and European traditions. He has served as professor at Youngstown State University in Ohio, as well as Professor of Music and Composer-in-Residence at Virginia's Norfolk State University. He is currently Professor of Music and Eminent Scholar at Old Dominion University in Norfolk.

On playing and writing for the organ, Hailstork remarked that is more natural to him than the piano is, because of the sustained sounds and the kind of rich textures that one can get on the organ. Today's prelude and postlude come from a set of four organ pieces based on spirituals dating from 1999.

## **GRANT OPPORTUNITY - FAITH JOURNEYS: YOURS AND OURS**

As a part of our collective commitment to be a Teaching Church, the Christian Formation Committee announces the opening of a small grants program intended to support Old South members on their faith journeys and encouraging them to bring their own learning back to the community. Grants of up to \$3,000 will be awarded to Old South members to support experiences leading to personal spiritual growth and faith formation (such as attendance at a conference or enrollment in a course, participation in an advocacy or service learning endeavor, leadership development or training, or immersion experiences that enable intersectional relationship-building). ## GREENTIP: '21 MOMENT OF HOPE—SHELL ORDERED TO CUT EMISSIONS

Shell was ordered to cut its carbon emissions by 45% by 2030. In a landmark case against Royal Dutch Shell, the oil and gas company was ordered to reduce its emissions by 45% in the next decade. Take this with a grain of salt as Shell has appealed the case. Yet, the fact that a ruling favored the planet (lawsuit filed by Friends of the Earth Netherlands) is a win.
