

Whatever you choose to give you may want to wrap it yourself. This allows you to put even more time and care into your gift—which is a part of this experience— and to personalize it. During the period between Thanksgiving and New Year's, Americans throw away 25% more trash than any other time of the year, which amounts to 25 million tons of garbage. The good news is, there are many ways to wrap your gifts more sustainably! A great option is to save bags and gift wraps from presents you receive. Store them until the time comes when you need them. Other ideas are to reuse shipping or shoe boxes, use old newspapers or magazines, reuse fabrics (try the furoshiki method), reuse scraps of papers you have at home, repurpose mason jars, reuse old maps, or recycle paper.
