

NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

One of Contemporary Christian Music's rising stars, **Audrey Assad** spent her early years in New Jersey, the daughter of an American mother and Arab-American father of Syrian descent. Relocating to Florida when she was 18, Assad briefly attended college before turning her focus to her nascent singing career. She recorded a well-received demo in 2003, but it was only after her move to Nashville in 2008 that things began to take off. Her major break came following the release of her first album, when Assad was signed by Sparrow Records; in the years since, she has worked and toured with a number of chart-topping Christian Contemporary artists and bands, including Chris Tomlin, Matt Maher, Tenth Avenue North, and Jars of Clay. *Spirit of the Living God* was released on the 2013 album *Fortunate Fall*, and is heard today in an arrangement for choir by American composer and arranger Joseph Martin.

Eurydice V. Osterman, whose arrangement of *Oh, What A Beautiful City* is featured during this week's offertory, is an author and composer whose works have been performed worldwide. Dr. Osterman earned both her Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from Andrews University, and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Composition from The University of Alabama.

In a teaching career spanning more than thirty years, Osterman served Oakwood University in Alabama as Professor of Music, chair of the department, and conductor of university choirs; she also served as chair or the Department of Music at Northern Caribbean University in Jamaica. Dr. Osterman is an accomplished organist and has conducted seminars throughout the United States, Europe, the Caribbean, South America, and Africa.

Gerre Hancock was best known for his tenure as Organist and Master of Choristers at Saint Thomas Church in New York City. Before this appointment, Dr. Hancock held positions at Christ Church Cathedral in Cincinnati and St. Bartholomew's Church in New York City, where Old South's late Minister of Music Harry Huff also served for a time. Dr. Hancock was also known for his improvisational skills, the style of which is reflected in the harmonic language of his *Air for Organ*. The reflective beginning and end of the piece frame a more majestic middle section and afford the performer an opportunity to showcase many of the colorful solo reed stops of Old South's E.M. Skinner organ.
